This course examines historical periods and influential theories related to contemporary psychology with emphasis on the evolution of scientific method in psychology. The course will also examine professional issues including ethics in psychological research and practice.

Learning outcome - On completing the course, each student should be able to:

- Describe the prevailing movements at different times in the history of psychology.
- Evaluate critically different movements in the history of psychology.
- Name the main pioneers of different ideologies in the history of psychology.
- Connect different movements to historical events and the prevailing spirit of the times.
- Compare the concepts and methods of different movements.
- Describe the main ethical rules which psychologists follow in their work.

Course assessment

In class exercises, discussions, written assignments and final exam. Grades are given on a 0-10 point scale. The minimum grade to pass the course is 5.0. The student needs to get a minimum grade of 5.0 in the final exam and a minimum average grade of 5.0 for all course assessment.
